The Reach – Test – Treat intervention was developed for engaging men who have sex with men (MSM) into the HIV counseling and testing services.

The manual offers detailed recommendations on enrolling MSM to HIV testing through the social media networks. The manual contains a description of theories underlying the approaches to on-line counseling, as well as and guidance for implementing organizations on staffing, work place design, interaction with medical facilities, etc.

This manual is recommended for social workers, psychologists, medical staff and other specialists working on HIV prevention among MSM.

It includes detailed recommendations for organizations intending to implement the intervention such as staff recruitment, selection of location, interaction with healthcare facilities, etc.

The publication gives a clear outline of intervention-specifics, tools, techniques, and implementation strategy.

Clients of non-governmental organizations hold the opportunity to influence two important areas of their lives: health and financial independence reinforcing each other during the implementation of the intervention.

This program consists of two interventions: Patient School and Studio of Opportunities.

The intervention is implemented over six individual counselling sessions and lasts for about six months. The Patient School program is designed as part of an integrated intervention but it can be an independent intervention as well.

The Studio of Opportunities was designed as part of an integrated intervention, but it can be implemented as an independent intervention as well.

The intervention combines individual counselling and comprehensive case management. The intervention was designed based on the effective behavioral intervention Seven Steps adapted by the USAID's RESPOND project from its original Psycho-Medical Intervention Model.

The manual outlines details of the intervention, methodologies, instruments, and the implementation strategy.

The Partner Health intervention is aimed at enrolling sexual partners of PLHIV and people injecting drugs into HIV counselling and testing services.

This manual contains detailed recommendations on motivating clients to disclose their PLHIV and/or PWID status and to enroll their sexual partners for HIV testing. The manual also contains the description of theories underlying the approaches to counselling, as well as recommendations for implementing organizations on staffing, work place design, interaction with medical facilities, etc.

This manual is recommended for social workers, psychologists, medical providers and other specialists working in the field of HIV prevention and social support to PLHIV.

The training tutorial on the Integrated opioid addiction treatment in primary health care settings is focused on the current public health issue: the provision of comprehensive medical services to patients with drug addiction, and particularly those with comorbidities, such as HIV and TB.

Treatment of this key population within primary care settings allows for a significant increase in coverage and a reduction of stigma and discrimination against people with opioid addiction.

The tutorial was designed for family doctors, narcologists, interns, and mid-level health professionals working in medication-assisted treatment programs and programs providing integrated treatment of socially significant comorbid conditions.



Seven Steps: A cognitive behavioral intervention to prevent HIV, STI, and viral hepatitis among injecting drug users through individual counselling and case management. Implementation Manual

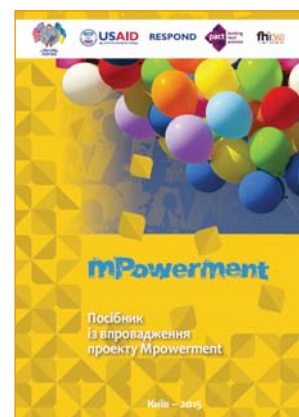

Mpowerment is an integrated intervention designed in the US in the early 1990s as an evidence-based approach to HIV prevention among young MSM (18-29 years old).



Mpowerment seeks to develop safe sexual practices and HIV testing as a social norm within the MSM community. The approach applied in the intervention is unique as HIV prevention and testing are seamlessly built into a broader range of activities of interest to the MSM community.

This program offers to recently released individuals the opportunities to develop their personal behavior management and problem solving skills, as well as the ability to identify additional resources for support. Program materials were developed by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, translated and adapted to Ukrainian context by the USAID’s RESPOND Project. Materials include the Implementation Manual and Facilitator’s Guide.

The Manual is recommended for social workers, psychologists and other specialists working in the field of HIV/STI/hepatitis prevention among people returning from penitentiary facilities.

This compilation presents QI success stories from the USAID RESPOND Project improving HIV services in eight pilot regions of Ukraine: Dnipropetrovsk, Zaporizhzhya, Kyiv, Kirovograd, Mykolaiv, Odesa, Kherson and Kyiv City.

Successful QI Changes are illustrated by region-specific process indicators demonstrating a positive trend or excess over a baseline median measured before implementation. Each process indicator also represents a contribution to the higher-level outcome indicator related to the corresponding gap in the HIV service cascade.

The Quality Improvement model is a major instrument for implementing changes to improve the quality of services provided by healthcare facilities at different levels.



This model provides a complex, integrated, and dynamic approach for improving the results of the system's performance and its continuing modification and development. The Quality Improvement model is universal and highly relevant at the time of healthcare system reform, tightening accreditation and certification requirements for healthcare facilities, and the evolving system of protecting the patient rights.

This training manual was designed for the CME course on quality improvement for managers of healthcare institutions and specialists responsible for quality management at the facility or department level.

The HOW TO guide on quality improvement (QI) contains practical guidelines prepared by the U.S. CDC for developing countries. The document offers ready-to-apply instruments and methods of quality improvement for healthcare systems and services.

This guide was translated and adapted to the Ukrainian context by the USAID RESPOND Project to improve the quality of HIV services for key populations. Some illustrations in the book have been adapted or changed to fit the context.

The quality improvement guide is a comprehensive and practical manual containing ten modules which cover philosophies, such as the psychology of change, development of changes, sustainability and scaling up, as well as the implementation of specific tools, such as process maps, PDSA cycles, and run charts. These modules offer practical and user-friendly improvement instruments ready for use.

This guide on QI will be of interest for medical staff, social workers, psychologists and other specialists implementing QI projects in the field of healthcare. The manual provides guidance for people not familiar with the QI methodology and open new perspectives to experienced specialists.

The training course materials on HIV counseling and testing with the use of rapid tests were created for physicians of all specialties, nurses and social workers from primary health care institutions and specialized facilities that provide HIV services.

The training guide consists of two blocks: one on developing the HIV counselling skills, and the other on developing the skills on the use of rapid tests.

The training takes participants through the following topics: the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Ukraine, modes of HIV transmission and prevention methods, risk and risky behavior, stigma and discrimination towards vulnerable populations and PLHIV, stigmatization and its influence on the epidemic, regulatory framework in Ukraine around HIV/AIDS, effective communication, pre- and post-test HIV counselling, HIV testing methodology with the use of rapid tests, medical records and reporting related to rapid HIV testing.

The HIV Counseling and Testing (HCT) Training Course was developed under the project entitled “Institutionalization of HCT Training Course as an Element of the Post-Graduate Medical Training Curricula” implemented by the All-Ukrainian Charitable Organization «Chas Zhyttya Plus» with the support from the USAID RESPOND Project.



This course is unique given the compressed nature of the program: It is a five-day course versus ten-day courses offered by post-graduate medical institutions. In developing the course, the Ukrainian experience around HCT was utilized along with best international practices, particularly the “Trainer’s Guide on HIV Counseling in Asia and Pacific” (WHO, UNICEF, and FHI 360).

The course targets the development of counseling skills for different conditions: pre-test and post-test counseling, provider-initiated counseling and testing, counseling on treatment issues, counseling for specific client groups, counseling of suicidal clients, etc.

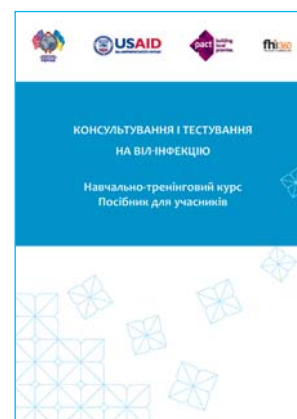

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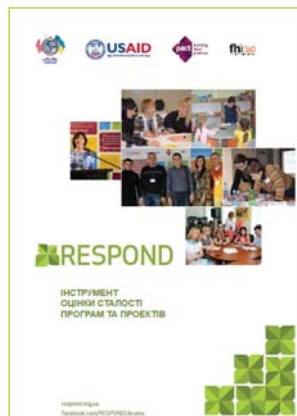

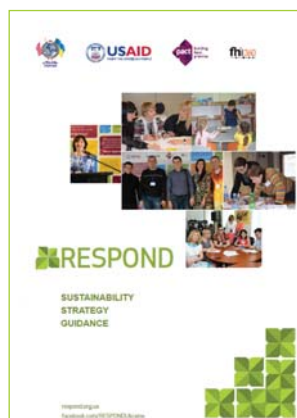

The Program Sustainability Assessment Tool belongs to the Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri, U.S.A. The capacity to sustain programs and projects is critical at all levels and in any environment. Unfortunately, when projects end due to their funding cycles, improvements achieved in the sphere of healthcare, medical and social services may wither.

With this instrument, projects' sustainability can be evaluated by analyzing sustainability components of the organizational capacity.

Evaluation results can be used for planning of sustainability strengthening activities for projects and/or the organization as a whole.

The purpose of a sustainability strategy is to provide an organization with a landscape analysis and support in making choices around its structure, resources, operations, and needs to ensure it sustains itself over a three-year period or longer. The strategy enables organizations to think outside its current projects, identify what is needed for sustainability and outline how to attain those markers. Based on the analysis of trends, the leadership of an organization can evaluate different opportunities, and decide not only what it should do, but also what it should not do.

This toolkit consists of a collection of tools, questions, and approaches useful in developing a sustainability strategy. It is constructed to provide guidance on the design of the strategy with minimum standards in mind. By following this process, the organization should be able to articulate and document the following:

1. Current state: where there is organization now
2. Future state: where the organization should be, and what and how it wants to sustain itself over the next three years or longer.

The publication may also be useful for non-governmental institutions and private entities interested in strategic information in the area of HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, care and support for key populations.

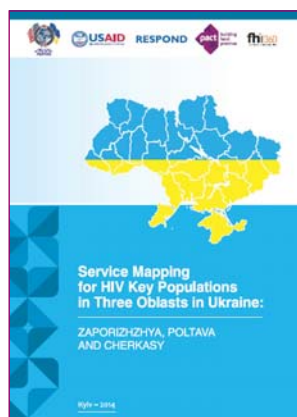


This publication contains an adapted methodology in creating interactive maps with ArcGIS.com, a free online platform.

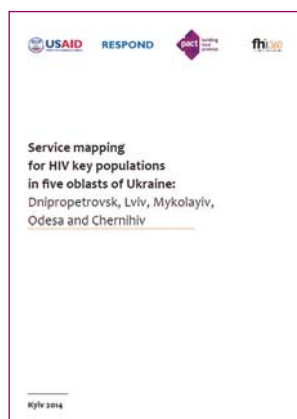

The report presents results of service mapping for key populations in Zaporizhzhia, Poltava and Cherkasy regions for the year 2014. Each region was analyzed considering its HIV standing within key populations.

This report can serve as reference for planning HIV response activities, assessing prevention activities and advocacy, which becomes extremely relevant when developing regional HIV/AIDS programs for a five year period.

Result of service mapping is useful for HIV service implementers including civil society and governmental agencies, M&E specialists, and decision-makers in the HIV/AIDS field.

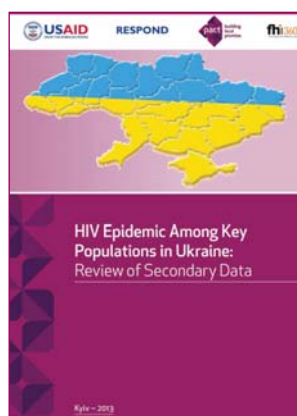

This report contains information on the methodology of data collection; processing and aggregation; creation of a database and its adaptation to geographic information software (GIS); types of maps; summary of information presented; and limitations with map analysis.

Service analysis and regional maps are provided separately for each oblast and its capital city. The only exception is Dnipropetrovsk oblast, where services are additionally presented for the city of Kryvyi Rih, which is the center of service provision for key populations. Each oblast is discussed in a separate section, presented in Ukrainian alphabetical order, with oblast-specific analysis and conclusions. A summary map is provided at the end of the report.

This report can be used in planning HIV response activities, assessing prevention activities, advocacy, etc. Mapping results are useful for HIV service implementers including civil society and governmental agencies, M&E specialists, and decision-makers in the HIV/AIDS field.

For each key populations, four main topics were reviewed and available data summarized: epidemiological data, behavioral and contextual information, legal and policy frameworks, and intervention and service coverage.
